


These are verbatim comments gathered from a random selection of students as part of baseline data gathered to measure children's initial understanding of SOLO as a language for learning. Gathering anecdotal data such as this is just one self review tool we use to evaluate the effect SOLO has on student learning.

We have purposefully included some student's misconceptions about SOLO to demonstrate the unbiased approach that our teachers have taken in the collecting and reporting of the data. This has highlighted the importance of informing students of not only what SOLO is, but what it stands for!


We will be repeating the exercise at the end of the year and hope to have no misconceptions.






It is Prestructural and Prestructural means you can share no ideas – you know nothing.

Multistructural means you can share more than two or one ideas. Relational is when you put words in the right place and when you connect words. Extended Abstract is when you can share heaps of ideas. We share them with our class and we can help other people.






Something you do by yourself – you think by yourself.

SOLO is the highest level; you can do it by yourself.

SOLO is when one person talks. You're not thinking properly if you're SOLO. The SOLO level is the prestructural level. You're not thinking much if you're at the SOLO level – you need help.






SOLO is something to help us learn better.

We use SOLO to understand and improve our work. It helps us to evaluate our work. SOLO shows us what level our thinking is on our work.

I think that SOLO is doing something by yourself. SOLO is a rubric like a reading rubric etc.






SOLO is a rubric that helps us when we are writing in Inquiry.

I think that SOLO means to be by yourself like working independently.

SOLO is a code that identifies what level your writing is. For example; Relational links ideas.






SOLO is prestructural, unistructural, multistructural, relational and extended abstract.

SOLO is a thing that evaluates your work and your thinking. It is also something that shows how you think.

SOLO is a chart that shows what level our thinking is or how much we know about one certain topic.






I think SOLO is working independently and on your own.

SOLO is the 5 signs – prestructural, unitstructural, multistructural, relational and extended abstract.


SOLO is a rubric that helps us level our work.

SOLO is like a code that tells you where your thinking is e.g. Relational is when you link ideas.






SOLO is a rubric that helps us when we are writing. In the rubric it has lots of ideas and it helps us to get to a high standard of writing.

SOLO is a code.


SOLO is an individual opinion on something and no one else's opinion. SOLO is independent.











At Unistructural we have one idea



We use SOLO to help us improve on things.


We use SOLO to help us make our work more interesting and to help us get to a higher level of thinking.


We use SOLO because it helps us.

We use SOLO because it helps improve and move your level of writing up.






We use SOLO to help us in our writing, reading and other things.

We use SOLO to help us to improve on things.






We use SOLO to help us on our work.

To help us with learning at school e.g. help us write arguments by using SOLO words such as evaluate, predict, overall.






We use SOLO to rate our work and to see how high we are. We use SOLO to see what words to use when we are writing.








To help people improve their work.


Why do we use SOLO Taxonomy?

We use SOLO to help us in our writing and get a good story or paragraph. Also we mainly use a rubric for double processing.


We use SOLO to understand how it feels to be by yourself. E.g. when you are doing your speech you are solo.









Year 0 to 1 Students






It tells us what is our next step and what we need to do.

Year 2 to 3 Students




It helps us so the teacher doesn't have to tell us. There are levels Prestructural to Extended Abstract.

We use it in Inquiry and Reading and in Maths. You can learn new words.






SOLO helps us by guiding us through steps to help us aim at a higher level and to get better.

SOLO helps us by telling us words to help us with reading etc. We use it by using the words in the SOLO rubric.






SOLO helps us to think more and makes us smarter by doing lots of maths or written language.




SOLO helps us because we can set goals and try to achieve them and we work hard to get to Extended Abstract in our writing and reading.

I think that SOLO can help us by working independently and when you are stuck and no one is there for you that means you have to work solo by yourself.






It helps by giving us a chance to see how we are thinking. Evaluating after helps us know if we are a high or low thinker.

SOLO helps us by guiding us up to extended abstract using words like above.






SOLO helps us by improving our writing skills at the end of the year so you're much better at writing.
